Staff Update

Our staff is really developing as a team! We're gaining increasing momentum and alignment the longer we work together. It's been such a blessing to settle in and move forward from a point of stability. We were blessed this year to be able to hire paid nursery workers for Sunday mornings: Alisa McLemore, Justine Guderian, and Joni Guntzel. We have also hired some key Interim Children's Ministry Directors: Ashley Joren, Annelise Sterneman, and Mandi Buchan.

Church Life

This summer, we switched to a new 10:45 a.m. service time. Overall, this seems to be going well as we head into 2020.

Attendance

Our 2019 Sunday morning attendance was 381, down almost 5% from last year's 400 average. While this is not the trend that we want to see, the real concern is making sure that those who are not Enlarging His Kingdom series, attending are doing ok. Every part of the church body needs the church and the church needs every part of the church body. May God help us to love and serve one another well.

Sermon Series

In 2019, I loved preaching through the Sermon on the Mount, the Summer Psalms series, a Baptism series, a Spiritual Training series, an an Advent series, as well as various "stand alone" sermons on topics like "Giving to God 1st" and "Hard Pressed Thankfulness."

Pastoral Update

In 2020, I'll enter my 5th year now as Lead Pastor. I serve about 55 hours a week. I spend about 20-25 of those hours preparing for the sermon and collaborating with our incredible musicians on the orders of worship. I invest about 10-12 hours in various meetings with staff and lay leaders. I meet with various people for counseling and encouragement about 8-10 hours a week. I spend the rest of my time emailing, talking over the phone, serving at weddings and funerals, visiting people, and so on. When I can make time, I also really enjoy spending time praying for and strategizing how our church can grow in our effectiveness of making disciples. I also enjoy coaching and encouraging some younger pastors in our area.

Life Groups

Being part of a Life Group this year has been a great source of personal blessing. I'm so thankful that Pastor Eric has helped bring these together. If you aren't in a Life Group, you should really prayerfully consider joining one! Life Groups have the very real potential to radically transform our church into an incredibly mature and deeply caring community of believers.

Formation Groups

It's hard to believe that we launched Formation Groups back in January 2019. In addition to our Listening to Jesus and Growing in Grace Sunday School classes, we added a new option for adults at 9:45 am. With Formation Groups, we hope to foster an environment where solid teaching and group discussion leads us to consider how the gospel forms our thinking, our priorities, and our relationships. These Formation Groups would not have been possible without the each week. Life Groups are designed to help of so many excellent teachers and group discussion leaders. Life Groups

For me, the highlight of 2019 has to be the launch of Life Groups here at E-Free Bemidji. In early September we kicked off the fall ministry season with team jerseys and tailgating in the church parking lot. That week, we set sail with six new sermon-based discussion small groups meeting throughout the week. I thank God for the leaders and hosts who are faithfully serving our church family be a place where our people can learn together and can love one another. I can testify that this is exactly what is taking place when our Life Groups gather together. In 2020, I am prayerfully asking the Lord to raise up additional Life Group leaders and hosts so that more and more of our people can be a part of the discipleship growth taking place through these groups.

Student Ministries

2019 was a great year for our student ministry. We saw students come to accept and follow Jesus as their personal savior, while others deepened their discipleship walks.

Last January we were able to start a new middle school winter retreat with Camp Oak Hills, despite the -30 degree temperatures. Other major events that took place in the spring of 2019 included a lock-in, a well-received prayer night, our annual district conference in Duluth, as well as a weekly focus on the meaning of discipleship. We wrapped up the spring saying goodbye to some amazing seniors. It is hard saying goodbye to such great students but we are grateful for the road that God has for them. Over the summer we spent each month gathering together around a campfire. With my wedding smack dab in the middle of the summer we had to play around with that. However at the end of the summer, the high school students and I went to the Island at Camp Shamineau. We had a great few days. Wet, but great. We were able to spend time growing in relationships together as well as looking forward to the fall.

As school started in the Fall of 2019, we saw a great number of new students join us on Wednesday nights. A huge encouragement to start the year. This 2019/2020 school year we have been walking through the book of Galatians. Specifically, how the book of Galatians can help us bring gospel clarity to our everyday lives. Seeing the world through the lenses of the gospel is our main teaching point for the year. God showed up in big ways this past fall. We were able to have a group of 50 go to Camp Shamineau's Fall Fling retreat. Students were able to draw closer to Jesus and enjoy perfect weather. We held two outreach parties. One in October and then closed 2019 with a Christmas party in December. During our Sunday school times throughout 2019, both high school and middle school students have learned more about their own spiritual formation. A key distinctive for our Sunday school.

Young Adult Ministries

As young adults enter and leave college, join the ranks in the work force, or start families, they show the drive and devotion it will take to be the next generation of leaders in our church.

Leaders like Dan Frost who has been serving in Sunday School and youth group but who has stepped up to serve on our trustee board. There are so many young adults at our church who are committed to following Jesus.

In our young adult ministry, we have experimented with several types of ministries; small groups, worship nights, etc. We are continuing to strive to find our niche in Bemidji however.

Kid's Ministries

First, I want to sincerely thank the pastors, staff, trustees, elders and this congregation for your willingness and flexibility in supporting me during my husband, Eric's health crisis and our family's situation this fall. This has been difficult for me to write because of the current shadow that lays over my personal life right now but I do not want that to "over shadow" all the good that has transpired in KidsMin. this past year. I enjoy writing these reports and



taking the time to reflect and see what God has done, is doing and will do. It is good to look back and thank God for his faithful hand in our church, kids' ministry and my own life.

This past year was the first full calendar year that I was able to direct and lead our Wednesday and Sunday ministries. I continued on with the curriculum choices I had made the previous year and honestly believe that consistency and follow through is key to giving the kids at E Free a solid foundation that builds on what they have learned and not just repeating Bible stories from the Old Testament over and over because we change curriculum. Every curriculum has its benefits and drawbacks, there is no perfect curriculum, however I am very satisfied and happy with what we are using. On Sundays we continue Answers for Kids for Sunday School (PreK through 3rd), A Case for Faith of Kids (4-5th grade Tweens') and TeamKID on Wednesday nights for E Free Kids Club.

Power UP Camp - 2019

Last year at this time I mentioned that the Covenant Church and E Free Kids were considering collaborating for a city-wide VBS – Power UP Camp. That collaboration took place August 4th-7th and was very positive for both churches and for many, many kids.

We worked extremely hard organizing, decorating, promoting and executing an awesome VBS. We had 286 kids register and averaged 240 per night. We had 100+ volunteers between the 2 churches. One of the benefits to working together on this kids' event was the shared work load, the benefit of combining financial resources, the advantage of talents and giftings from a greater pool of individuals but the greatest in my opinion was the testimony of unity it spoke to the community about our 2 churches.

Our "Kick Off" this fall in our kids' ministry was definitely impacted by Power UP as many kids, families and additional volunteers have plugged in to our kids programming because of that event.

Power UP was a ton of work and really took all of my energy & focus from May to August but I will testify and say – it was worth it! As of today, I am not planning a large, collaborative, city-wide VBS for this summer – but would prayerfully consider it for 2021.

E-Free Kids

This past fall we added a separate class for 1st graders because our numbers have increased (prior the classes had been 2 grades combined).

I anticipate that the fall of 2020 we will add a 2nd grade class and that every classroom in the lower level will be used. This really is exciting for me and us as a church, it shows that we are seeing a commitment from younger families and from faithful volunteers committed to our church body.

We also officially implemented our secure check-in system this year in all areas of ministry from Nursery to every organized KidsMin scheduled event.

Sabbatical Update

On this "unexpected" sabbatical my passion and love of Jesus, kids and E Free Kids ministry has not died off. God is using this time in my life to renew and move me into a greater love for him and His church.

Many people have asked me "if & when" I will return to my role. I can confidently say that it is my heart's desire to back soon but at this point our family has many unknowns and I am unsure of the timing.

I have been spending more time in the office this month doing behind-the-scenes-work. I am hoping to be more visible and slowly transition back in and help out when I can.

Please continue to BOLDLY pray for our church, our church body, and all the ministries. My vision for KidsMin continues to be the same. Please pray that KidsMin will be a growing-thriving-effective-powerful part of the larger church body that disciples and leads kids and families to Jesus. *May our love for Christ and one another point the world to our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

I continue to facilitate the Welcome Table in our church foyer. I coordinate the volunteer schedule and stock the materials that are used to welcome guests to our church. In November we gave away the last of the church mugs, which were ordered in 2015. We now have new mugs to give as a gift to welcome guests to our Sunday morning services. My prayer for 2020 is that we will continue to make our welcoming ministries a priority, and that we will grow in our ability to help those who are new to our congregation feel welcomed and valued.

Trustee Board

The Trustees again want to thank the Congregation for their generous and consistent support of our Church and its ministries.

In 2019 we did fall just short of our budgeted giving by about \$6,800. (\$665,885 required vs \$659,023 actually given to the General Fund). In the late summer of 2019, we were actually over \$30,000 behind but a strong final quarter helped close the gap. Had we not had a Sunday Service cancelled on the last Sunday of the year (due to hazardous travel – weather problems) we likely would have reached our budget goal.

The actual dollars spent for 2019 in the General Budget was \$656,135 and total income was \$666,876 (which includes building rent & interest income), leaving net income of plus \$10,740. In other words the Church did bring in more cash, than was spent.

The budget approved for 2020 by the Congregation in October does call for a 4.6% increase in giving. In 2019 the budget was not increased. In addition to increasing the general budget in the coming year, we have also merged the Global Partners budget.

The Global Partners budget is now 31 line items in our General budget. For 2020 these 31 line items for the Global Partners was not increased, and remains at the same level as 2019.
