

# Sermon-based Discussion Questions

“Next Gen Discipleship” from 6/21/2020

Proverbs 4:1-10

SPOILER ALERT: *You may not want to read these until AFTER you have heard the sermon.*

1. Read Proverbs 27:17. Do you prefer to teach or to be taught? Explain. Share about someone in your life who has disciplined you or been disciplined by you.
2. Read 1 Timothy 1:2 and Philemon 10. Why is it sometimes difficult to be teachable and allow someone else to disciple us? What might keep us from discipling someone else?
3. When it comes to growing in wisdom, how would you explain the relationship between our mind, our heart, and our character development? Read Proverbs 2:10 and 4:4. Why do you think it might be important for us to disciple hearts and not just minds?
4. Read Proverbs 4:1-10. Talk about the importance of discipling “from generation to generation” and discipling “both men and women.” What are some practical ways that we can make this happen in our lives?
5. Once we have done our best to disciple someone well, why is it important for us to leave the results up to God? How might this apply to verses like Proverbs 22:6?
6. How might being in a discipleship relationship help us during challenging times like COVID-19 and the current racial tension in our world?
7. How can we encourage one another toward discipling the next generation? Is there someone you want to ask to disciple you? Has someone asked you to disciple them?
