Discussion Questions *How to Answer the Wisdom of Fools* Proverbs 26:4-5 July 12, 2020

- 1. What is one of your favorite stories? Who is the hero of the story and who is the villain? How do these two characters interact with each other?
- 2. When do you find yourself being drawn into an argument? When does the argument tend to move from friendly to foolish?
- 3. Consider the phrase "The way of a fool is right in his own eyes" (Pr. 12:15; cf. Pr. 3:7). Do you think it's fair to describe someone as a *fool* or *delusional* when they pursue their own way rather than God's? Why or why not?
- 4. Without getting into specifics, when have you seen arguments become divisive or destructive? How do we discern when to avoid them (cf. 2 Tim. 26:4) and when silence might make things worse?
- 5. Read Matthew 21:23-22:46. What can the example of Jesus teach about answering a fool? What do you think Jesus was trying to do in these confrontations?
- 6. Read 1 Corinthians 1:18-2:5. How might resolving to preach the gospel, both to ourselves as well as to others, aid in answering and avoiding foolish arguments?
