Sermon-based Discussion Questions

"Spirit-filled" from 9/27/2020 Acts 2:1-41

<u>SPOILER ALERT</u>: You may not want to read these until AFTER you have heard the sermon.

- 1. When you hear, "Spirit-filled," what comes to mind? Does the idea of being Spirit-filled intrigue you, frighten you, or something else?
- How would you explain the day of Pentecost in your own words? What kind of an impact do you think the Holy Spirit had on people in Acts 2:1-13?
- 3. Read Acts 1:8 and compare it with Acts 2:5-11. How might this explain one of the reasons why God filled them with the Holy Spirit and enabled them to speak in other languages?
- 4. Take a look at Peter's explanation of Pentecost in Acts 2:16-36, especially verses 16-23, 32-33. How do you think this might explain why God sent the Holy Spirit? (Consider verses 32-33 and 36, which mention the collective activity of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.)
- 5. Read Acts 2:37-41. How would you describe the people's reaction to Peter's words? In your own words, how would you explain what it means to "repent and be baptized"?
- 6. Imagine a church going from 120 people to 3,120 people in a single day? What might that look like?
- 7. Acts 2:39 says that the Holy Spirit is "for all whom the Lord our God will call." So, if we're a Christ-follower, then we have the Holy Spirit within us. What do you think that this empowerment means for Christ-followers today?
- 8. Pray together for Spirit-filled lives that will empower our witness. How else can we pray for one another?
