Sermon-based Discussion Questions

1. Who is one of your favorite Old Testament prophets and why? What is one question you'd like to ask them?
2. Revelation 9:20-21 records the people's stubborn unrepentance. Why do you think God follows this up by sending in his prophetic witnesses in chapters 10-11?
3. In Revelation 10:4 John is told that he shouldn't write down what the seven thunders said. What might this teach us about what John is seeing and hearing?
(Also consider Acts 1:6-8)
4. In Revelation 10:9-11, when John "eats" the scroll, it tastes sweet but then turns his stomach sour. Have you ever had an experience like this with something you've read in the Bible? Why do you think it might be important for us to read and teach every part of the Bible?
5. Revelation 11:1-13 records the ministry of the Two Witnesses. What might be some of the key takeaways from their example?
6. In Revelation 11:15-19, the 7th trumpet is followed by more worship in heaven. What encourages you from this passage?
7. Revelation 10-11 are filled with reminders of God's prophetic witnesses. What are some practical ways that we can be a witness in our world today?
